Special team to follow-up India-Oman CEPA

MUSCAT: The Ministry of Commerce confirmed that a national rapid intervention team will be formed to follow up on the implementation of CEPA agreement and address any challenges that may face the affected sectors or companies, noting its aspiration to complete the necessary legislative and legal procedures to ratify the agreement in preparation for its entry into force.

The ministry stressed that the negotiations were based on specialised studies, including an economic study prepared by Deloitte

& Touche commissioned by the ministry, which addressed the expected effects of liberalising cus-

toms duties, export growth and investment expansion and proved the feasibility of the agreement and its

ability to maximise added value within the national economy and enhance the competitiveness of Omani

exports in foreign markets.

The ministry of commerce stated that the volume of trade exchange between Oman and India reached about \$7 billion in 2024, which makes India one of the most prominent trading partners of Oman, especially in the field of

Over 15mn tourists spend SR33bn in Riyadh until end of 3Q 2025

RIYADH: The Riyadh region recorded a remarkable tourism performance during the current winter season, receiving more than 15.1 million tourists from inside and outside the country until the end of the third quarter. This reflects the growing attractiveness of the capital as a

major destination for business and entertainment.

Data from the Ministry of Tourism showed that total tourist spending reached approximately SR33 billion during the same period, including both domestic and international tourists. This shows the direct economic impact of the tour-

ism boom in the region.

The ministry's data also indicated an 18pc increase in total tourist spending compared with the previous period, driven by the diversification of events and tourism activities, along with the development of infrastructure

Star Air to be first regional carrier to take off from Navi Mumbai airport

NEW DELHI: Bengaluru - headquartered Star Air will launch operations from the Navi Mumbai International Airport (NMI). Starting Dec 25, the regional carrier will introduce new flights from NMI to Ahmedabad, Goa (Mopa), Bengaluru and Nanded.

The new schedule includes services such as Navi Mumbai-Ahmedabad, Navi Mumbai-Nanded via Ahmedabad, Navi Mumbai-Goa (Mopa) and Navi Mumbai-Bengaluru via Goa (Mopa). Star Air will use Embraer 175 aircraft to fly between these sectors. Capt.

Simran Singh Tiwana, Chief Executive Officer, Star Air, said that they are the only regional airline launching from NMIA, which is an extension of their commitment to connect real India with convenient and time-saving options.

"These new routes will give travellers from Navi

Mumbai and the wider Mumbai Metropolitan Region easy access to important regional cities through Star Air's ever-growing network, while also opening new opportunities for trade, tourism and investment," he added.

UAE tourism records robust growth on back of reforms, innovation



Saudi Arabia unites GCC in heritage tourism

RIYADH: Heritage has become an important pillar of national identity and tourism across the GCC. Saudi Arabia, the UAE, Qatar, Oman, Bahrain and Kuwait are investing in museums, restored districts and conservation projects that foreground local history.

Saudi Arabia

Saudi Arabia's flagship heritage project is Diriyah Gate, which surrounds At-Turaif—the mud-brick citadel of the first Saudi state. A royal decree brought UNESCO recognition. The Diriyah Gate Development Authority is building Najdi-style hotels and a mixed-use square that opened in 2024, creating a neighbourhood where cafés, shops and cultural venues reinforce the historic character.

Further north, the Royal Commission for Al-Ula is executing the Journey Through Time masterplan, which divides the valley into heritage districts and pairs archaeological preservation with museums, eco-lodges and interpretive trails through 2035.

UAE

In Sharjah, the Heart of Sharjah project is revitalising the city's historic core. Led by

the government's Investment and Development Authority (Shurooq), the five-phase programme is preserving houses, souqs and mosques and repurposing them as museums, workshops and cafés. Completion is expected in 2025, with the restored district seeking UNESCO World Heritage nomination.

Abu Dhabi is building the Saadiyat Cultural District on Saadiyat Island. Its centrepiece, the Zayed National Museum, will open in Dec 2025 and celebrate the life of Sheikh Zayed and the UAE's heritage.

Qatar

Qatar Museums is developing Dadu, Children's Museum of Qatar, the nation's first children's museum. While construction continues, Dadu Gardens has opened as an outdoor space where children learn about gardening and sustainability through play. The broader museum will nurture creativity and support national education goals.

Oman

Oman's Ministry of Heritage and Tourism funds community-led restoration of forts, mosques and other traditional structures. In

2024 it supported more than 20 projects to preserve vernacular architecture and encourage tourism. The country is also completing the Oman Botanic Garden, a 500-hectare conservation site near Muscat.

Bahrain

Bahrain celebrates its pearl heritage through the Pearling Path, a three km route in Muharraq. Managed by the Bahrain Authority for Culture and Antiquities, it links offshore oyster beds with restored merchant houses and mosques and narrates how pearls were harvested and traded.

Kuwait

Kuwait is diversifying tourism with projects highlighting geology and modern history. The Kuwait Geopark will showcase desert landscapes and archaeological sites north of Kuwait City. A UNESCO-backed initiative in Al-Ahmadi (2024–2025) is documenting the town's souq, cinema and neighbourhoods and planning heritage-based regeneration. In Kuwait City the cabinet has revived a delayed Heritage Village that envisages a hotel, shops and villas inspired by traditional architecture.



GULF FAQS

Can heavy rains a reason to abstain from work? Can employer deduct salary?

We work in a mainland Dubai company and stay in Sharjah. We were unable to report to the office last week because of the rains. Can my company deduct my salary for being unable to report to work during the heavy rains and subsequent floods that happened? If our boss does, can we complain?

Pursuant to your queries, it is assumed that the nature of your work requires your physical presence in the workplace/office of your employer.

Therefore, the provisions of Federal Decree Law No. 33 of 2021 Regulating Employment Relations in the UAE and Cabinet Resolution No. 1 of 2022 on the Implementation of Federal Decree Law No. 33 of

2021 Regarding the Regulation of Employment Relations are applicable.

In the UAE, during unstable weather or when a forecast is issued by the

leaves. This is in accordance to Article 36 of the Cabinet Resolution No. 1 of 2022, which states: "Subject to the provisions of the Employment Law and this

Furthermore, an employer may consider accommodating an employee if the latter reports late to work due to unstable weather. This is in accordance with Article 15(1)(a) of the Cabinet Resolution No. 1 of 2022, which states: "Subject to the provisions of Article 17 of the Employment Law: 1. The period spent by the employee commuting

Resolution No. 1 of 2022, which states, "Subject to the provisions of Article 26 of the Employment Law

- If the failure to enable the employee to perform his work is due to circumstances beyond the employer's control, the employer shall inform the employee thereof along with guaranteeing the payment of his salary."

Based on the aforementioned provisions of law, as you are not able to travel to your office and work due to genuine reasons which were beyond your control, your employer should not deduct your salary.

However, as an employee, you must inform your employer about your situation by providing photos and document evidence to your employer, to show the reasons why you were not able to travel to work.

It may be due to heavy rains or water logging in the locality where you reside. If your employer deducts your salary for not coming to work due to the heavy rain and water-logging situation, you may file a complaint against your employer with the MoHRE.

National Meteorology Center (NCM), the Ministry of Human Resources and Emiratisation (MoHRE) may advise employers to opt for remote working options or grant employees paid

Moreover, if there are reasons beyond the employer's control (force majeure circumstances such as heavy rain, emergency situations) that render them unable to have regular operations, the employer may inform the employee and assure payment of salary for such period and days. This is in accordance with Article 17(2) of the Cabinet

Can I claim compensation when someone shares my photos without permission?

My wife and I are parting ways on mutual terms. What changes am I legally permitted to make to my will in Dubai under these circumstances? What are the relevant rules and procedures I should be aware of?

Pursuant to your queries, the provision of the personal status for non-Muslims is applicable; it is assumed that you are not a Muslim by your faith and you already have a will. A testator has full freedom to dispose of their estate as they see fit, and such wills should be registered.

Article 11 of the Federal Decree-Law No. 41 of 2022 on Civil Personal Status for Non-Muslims states: "The testator shall have the right to leave a will with the entire property he owns in the State

in favour of anybody he wants in accordance with the controls specified by the Executive Regulations of this Decree-Law." You

may at any time change your beneficiaries, remove your spouse, or alter executor appointments at your sole and absolute discretion. The amended will must follow the required formalities, such as being in writing, signed before the competent authority, and, where necessary, witnessed so that it is legally enforceable in Dubai.

In conclusion, you may update or revoke your will at any time to reflect your mutual separation. It is advisable to complete the process through the proper registry to ensure your wishes are valid under UAE law. You may consult a legal practitioner in the UAE for further advice.

You are entitled to compensation for the harm you suffered based on the verdict from the Criminal

Court, which serves as proof of the case. The verdict clearly shows that the man was convicted of violating your privacy and the unlawful act cited in the verdict forms the basis for your current lawsuit.

The man's liability, the harm you suffered and the causal link between the act and the harm have all been established by the verdict. However, there is no specific amount or maximum limit for compensation. You have the right to request an amount based

on the harm and damages you have incurred, and the Court will assess the appropriate compensation accordingly. It is important to submit any supporting documents you have to strengthen your claim.

In all cases, compensation is determined based on the extent of harm suffered by the victim, along with any loss of profit, provided that such loss is a natural consequence of the harmful act, in accordance with Article 292 of the Civil Transactions Law.



India's exports to US register rebound amid rising tariffs

NEW DELHI: In a year defined by significant trade volatility, India's exports to the US have undergone a remarkable two-step transformation. According to a new report from the Global Trade Research Initiative (GTRI), 85pc of India's US exports followed a distinct pattern of a sharp mid-year decline followed by a resilient partial recovery by Nov 2025.

The GTRI analysis highlights that total exports to the US fell 20.7pc dropping from \$8.8 billion in May to \$7.0 billion in November. The fall peaked in Sept, when shipments hit a trough of \$5.5 billion—a 37.7pc plunge from May levels. However, between Sept and Nov, exports rebounded by 27.3pc.

(Cont. from page - 1) non-oil exports, which include polyethylene, urea, gypsum, ethylene and several industrial products related to the petrochemical and metals sectors, and it is expected to witness greater expansion in light of what the agreement provided in terms of advanced preferential access to the Indian market.

The ministry noted that, under the agreement, Oman achieved a high

GTRI Founder Ajay Srivastava noted that this recovery occurred even as the US maintained a steep 50pc tariff on many Indian goods. "The drop between May and September likely reflected the shock and uncertainty created by impending tariff hikes," Srivastava explained. He added that once the higher tariffs became certain, exporters and US buyers adjusted by renegotiating prices, absorbing costs, and restocking for the holiday season.

The "fall-and-rebound" arc was visible across nearly all major product categories. As India's single largest export, smartphone ship-

ments crashed from \$2.29 billion in May to \$884.6 million in September before surging back to \$1.8 billion in November. The Gems and Jewellery sector saw one of the most powerful adjustments, plunging from \$500.2 million in May to \$202.8 million in Sept, then rebounding to \$406.2 million by Nov. Machinery and mechanical appliances neared a full recovery, ending Nov at \$614.6 million—just one per cent below May levels.

The textile sector faced intense pressure. Knitted apparel remains 33pc below May levels, while industrial textile fabrics collapsed by nearly 72pc.

TO BOOST INDIA'S EXPORTS, JOBS India, New Zealand FTA finalised

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi held a telephonic conversation with his New Zealand counterpart Christopher Luxon on Monday and both leaders announced the successful conclusion of the "historic, ambitious and mutually beneficial" India-New Zealand Free Trade Agreement (FTA).

"With negotiations having been initiated during PM Luxon's visit to India in March 2025, the two leaders agreed that the conclusion of the FTA in a record time of nine months reflects the shared ambition and political will to further deepen ties between the two countries," the Prime

Minister's Office (PMO) said in a statement.

"The FTA would significantly deepen bilateral economic engagement, enhance market access, promote investment flows, strengthen strategic co-operation between the two countries and also open up new opportunities for innovators, entrepreneurs, farmers, MSMEs, students and youth of both countries across various sectors," the PMO added.

Both leaders expressed confidence in doubling bilateral trade over the next five years as well as an investment of US\$20 billion in India from New Zealand over the next 15 years.

H-1B visa chaos deepens with new social media vetting rules

NEW DELHI: Confusion and last-minute travel upheavals swept through US visa applicants this week as a new social-media vetting policy of the US State

that your visa appointment has been rescheduled, Mission India looks forward to assisting you on your new appointment date."

"Arriving on your previously scheduled appointment date will result in your being denied admittance to the embassy or consulate," the embassy added. The disruption comes amid Washington's intensified social-media vetting policy, which requires applicants to make their social accounts public

and disclose all usernames used in the past five years.

The chaos deepened after the Trump administration announced an expanded security-screening protocol for H-1B visa applicants. An internal State Department cable instructed consular officers to examine applicants' resumes and LinkedIn profiles, and even those of family members, for any involvement in fields such as misinformation, disinformation, content moderation, fact-checking, compliance, or online safety. The chaos spilled over to Reddit, where anxious users shared stories of can-

celled flights and sleepless nights. "My flight was in nine hours. The agent told me I should attend biometrics on the 15th but wait to hear back about my Dec 23 interview. No way I'm taking that risk. This was my first trip in six years. Indigo issues back home were finally easing and then this came out of syllabus. I'm super frustrated" a user wrote.

Another user posted: "Given the cancellations happening, it's too big a risk. We cancelled our trip and will cancel our visa appointments too. Maybe the freed-up dates will help someone stuck in India."

For second time, Dubai Kerala expat wins Dh1 lakh

DUBAI: Sanil Kumar, a 40-year-old accountant from Kerala, is over the moon after winning Dh100,000 in the Big Ticket draw – for the second time. The long-time Dubai resident, who has called the city home with his family for 15 years, first got lucky last year in the weekly e-draw with

the same cash prize of Dh100,000. Now, luck has struck again through a consolation prize, making him a double winner in the popular promotion.

Sanil, who has been buying Big Ticket tickets consistently for the past five years, usually plays with a group of colleagues.
